

Amendments to 2008 Sailing Instructions

The joint DSC and WMYC Sailing Committees met on Thursday 24th April 2008 and the decision was taken that the Nass Beacon should be an Inner Limit Mark at the start, at the end of each lap and at the finish. Some amendments to the Sailing Instructions are therefore needed. These are:

8.2 An extra sentence is added at the end of this section, so the full wording now reads:

For all other races, unless amendments or alternative sailing instructions are given, courses will be taken from the 2008 WMYC and DSC combined Course Card. The number of the course to be sailed will be that displayed on the rail of the Committee Boat at the Fleet warning signal. The course number may be removed after the One Minute Signal and replaced with the course for the following fleet. If the number of the course displayed on the Committee Boat is followed by X2, this denotes that two laps of that course should be sailed, X3 denotes that three laps of that course should be sailed, etc. At the end of each lap, boats must pass through the Finish Line, as defined in section 12.1 of these instructions.

9.2.1. This is now shortened. The full wording now reads:

When the Nass start or finish line is used, the Nass Beacon is designated an Inner Limit Mark at both the start and the finish, but is not necessarily on the line.

12 This section is also amended, as well as 12.1.4 being deleted. The full wording now reads:

12 THE FINISH

The Finish Line

12.1.1 Will be between the main mast of the Committee Boat moored to the north of the Nass Beacon and the Outer Limit Mark 'S' (Black Flag) to the south of the Nass Beacon. Whilst not necessarily on the line, the Nass Beacon is designated an Inner Limit Mark at the finish.

12.1.2 When finishing in an easterly direction, leave the Outer Limit Mark 'S' (Black Flag) to starboard and the Committee Boat (and Nass Beacon) to port.

12.1.3 When finishing in a westerly direction, leave the Outer Limit Mark 'S' (Black Flag) to port and the Committee Boat (and Nass Beacon) to starboard.
